

BE AWARE OF BENZOS IN METH

Sold As: **SIDE (METH)**

Contained: **BENZODIAZEPINES + METH**

Appearance: COLOURLESS CRYSTAL

Risk: Naloxone will not reverse the effects of benzos

Potential Undesirable Effects: Sleepiness, memory loss, altered thinking, perceptions of safety/sobriety, risky behavior, passing out

Facts:

- Many benzos cause a strong feeling when inhaled
- Taking multiple doses will cause more undesirable effects
- Sedation can last minutes to hours
- If you do not use benzos, this will have a stronger effect for you
- If someone passes out from meth, make sure they can breathe and do not leave them alone
- Naloxone will not work on benzos, but always give naloxone when in doubt
- Benzos can cause intense withdrawal symptoms

To Reduce Your Risks When Using Any Drugs:

- 1. Do not use alone tell a sober buddy who can call for help
- 2. Test by using a small amount first, then go slow. If you have unwanted effects, stop.
- 3. Do not mix with alcohol or other drugs
- 4. Have naloxone on hand
- 5. Call 911 immediately if something does not feel right
- 6. Give breaths and Naloxone if someone has decreased breathing/signs of an overdose
- 7. Use the services available at an Overdose Prevention or Harm Reduction site near you
